DISCUSSION

Petitioner (CARES # [REDACTED]) was notified about two child care and one FoodShare (FS) overpayment in December, 2019. She did not appeal and has been repaying the claims. In October, 2020, she was notified about a second FS overpayment. She filed an appeal. Because her appeal letter did not specify which program she was appealing, this file was opened for petitioner potentially disputing the child care overpayments. At the hearing, she affirmed that she did not intend to appeal any of the 2019

claims. I thus will dismiss this appeal. I will address the 2020 FS overpayment in concurrent case no. FOP-200707.

THEREFORE, it is

ORDERED

That the petition for review is hereby dismissed.

REQUEST FOR A REHEARING

You may request a rehearing if you think this decision is based on a serious mistake in the facts or the law or if you have found new evidence that would change the decision. Your request must be **received within 20 days after the date of this decision**. Late requests cannot be granted.

Send your request for rehearing in writing to the Division of Hearings and Appeals, 4822 Madison Yards Way, 5th Floor North, Madison, WI 53705-5400 **and** to those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST." Your rehearing request must explain what mistake the Administrative Law Judge made and why it is important or you must describe your new evidence and explain why you did not have it at your first hearing. If your request does not explain these things, it will be denied.

The process for requesting a rehearing may be found at Wis. Stat. § 227.49. A copy of the statutes may be found online or at your local library or courthouse.

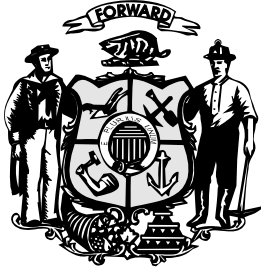
APPEAL TO COURT

You may also appeal this decision to Circuit Court in the county where you live. Appeals must be filed with the Court **and** served either personally or by certified mail on the Secretary of the Department of Children and Families, 201 West Washington Avenue, **and** on those identified in this decision as "PARTIES IN INTEREST" **no more than 30 days after the date of this decision** or 30 days after a denial of a timely rehearing (if you request one).
